Guidelines for Confirmation Candidates

The goals of our confirmation program are: to challenge the youth to grow deeper in their relationship with Jesus, to prepare them to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and to help them take ownership of their Catholic Faith.

Before receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation, complete the following:

- 1) ____Be a member of The Church of Holy Apostles as a family. (If you are not registered members, please supply us with a letter from the pastor of your parish stating that he gives you permission to receive the sacrament at The Church of Holy Apostles).
- 2) ___Supply us with your Baptismal certificate and First Communion Certificate. If you were baptized here let us know. If not, you must contact the parish in which you were baptized, and ask them to send Holy Apostles a Baptismal certificate. Certificate is due in immediately.
- 3) ___Candidates are asked to attend and participate in every aspect of the Confirmation Program. This includes all classes, Mass every weekend, Rites which will be held during masses (see calendar for dates)
- 4) ___Make— Up Family Assignments: Please ensure to communicate day of absences due to illness or medical emergency. All other absences (school events, sports, family travel). YOUTH will need to contact Youth Minister to obtain makeup activity/assignment. Three none communication absences will trigger automatic withdrawal from Confirmation preparation program and the candidate cannot be recommended to the Bishop for Sacrament of Confirmation in the spring.
- 5) ____ Know foundational Catholic prayers: The Lord's Prayer, the Nicene Creed, The Glory Be, and the Hail Mary. Knowledge of these prayers are demonstrated by your family active participation in celebration at Sunday Mass. Director of Confirmation Preparation program has authority to administer a prayer test to candidate and their parent or sponsor at any time during the Confirmation Preparation journey.

Guidelines for Confirmation Candidates

- 6) ____Witness your faith by completing 20 hours of service. A list of possible service opportunities https://thechurchofholyapostles.org/confirmation/ The service hour record sheet is due no later than the last year 2 class in February
- 7) ___ Choose a Confirmation sponsor. The sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, at least 16 years old. More information on sponsor selection is on the Sponsor Guidelines (attached) of this document). Teen submit sponsor name: https://tcoha.churchcenter.com/people/forms/553706
- 8) ___Select your Confirmation Name. Research and choose the name of a saint that exemplifies the life you would like to live. The Saint information page (attached) is due last Year 2 class of February.
- 9) ____ Attend the Year 2 Confirmation Retreat with your parent or sponsor. (see Year 2 calendar for dates)
- 10) __ Attend the Confirmation Rehearsal with your sponsor

Parental Role in Sacrament Preparation

"The initiation of children into the sacramental life is, for the most part, the responsibility and concern of Christian parents. They are to form and gradually develop a spirit of faith in the children, and with the help of catechetical institutions, prepare them for the fruitful reception of the Sacraments...This responsibility of the parents is also shown by their active participation in the celebration of the Sacraments."

- Serve as models for their son or daughter by growing in their personal relationship with God and living as committed Christians.
- Share their own faith with their son or daughter, both in word and action.
- Attend parent programs conducted to deepen their awareness of the meaning of Confirmation for Christian living, and to assist them as they help their son or daughter to come to freely request the Sacrament.
- Participate with their son or daughter in the special liturgies and events of the preparation program.
- Assist and encourage the teen to understand and assimilate what is being presented during the preparation period.
- Encourage the newly-confirmed member of their family to continue to be actively involved in the Church, especially their own parish.

Sponsor Guidelines

The sponsor should be a person who is prayerful, open, loving, and is comfortable sharing their faith with young people. A sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, who is at least sixteen years of age and has already received the Sacrament of Confirmation. The Candidate is encouraged to choose someone that they can share their faith with. A godparent who has been a real model of faith to a candidate logically completes his/her baptismal role by becoming a Confirmation sponsor. Your parents are not eligible to be your sponsor

The sponsor represents the support and prayers of the entire community of the Catholic Church. He or she will be the candidates "spiritual friend." In this program, the following is asked of the sponsor:

- 1. Pray for and with your candidate.
- 2. Represent the Church to your candidate in the way you live your life.
- 3. Guide your candidate to grasp the meaning and responsibilities involved in seeking the Sacrament of Confirmation.
- 4. Encourage your candidate to share their thoughts and feelings about being members of the Catholic Church.
- 5. Share what your faith means to you what you consider to be important in your relationship with Jesus.
- 6. Spend time with your candidate.
- 7. Write a letter to your candidate on what your Confirmation meant to you as a spiritual person and how you see God playing an active role in your life.
- 9. Attend the following masses:

Rite of Commitment: (see Year 2 calendar for dates)

- 10. Accompany your candidate to the rehearsal (date TBD)
- 11. Present your candidate to the Bishop during Confirmation (date TBD)

Choosing a Confirmation Saint

Due before but no later than last Year 2 class of February.

CHOOSING A CONFIRMATION SAINT

A patron saint is chosen by each person preparing for Confirmation. Regardless of your choice of whether to take on a name or stick with your own (especially if you were already named after a Saint whom you now reaffirm), everyone will pick a Confirmation saint to research. It is important and necessary to know something about the person or saint before you decide on taking their name.

With the help of your Sponsor, you will choose a saint for your Confirmation. The Confirmation Saint you choose will be one you will need to become familiar with and ask for their prayers to help you prepare to fully receive the Holy Spirit on your Confirmation Day.

HOW DO I CHOOSE A SAINT?

Begin by reading good biographies of saints, not just short descriptions of them. There are many good movies that faithfully depict the lives of the saints. [Good website to learn of saints and their attributes: http://catholicsaints.info/] After doing this you should select one saint or blessed whose spirituality or example you would like to follow knowing:

- That saint will become a particular friend on life's journey to Heaven.
- You may ask special intercessions from your patron in prayer.
- You should honor your patron saint by knowing his or her Feast Day and attending Mass is possible (Just like knowing the birthday of a good friend)
- You may choose a patron who is either a declared Saint or Blessed.

INSTRUCTIONS

Choose a canonized or beatified Saint of the Catholic Church, it CANNOT be Our Lord or a title given to Jesus (e.g. Divine Mercy, Holy Child). It can be a popular saint, one from the Bible (Old Testament saints count too!), or one more recently canonized a Saint or declared a Blessed.

Know the 5W's:

- Who, and if they changed their name, know also their birth name (e.g. Karol Woltyla for St. John Paul II)
- Where:
 - Where did they live and serve, and die>
- When:
 - What time period/century did they live? Years of birth and death
- What:
 - What did they do that showed Heroic Virtue
- Why:
 - What was the reason why they answered God's will or their primary motivation to follow their vocation (i.e. why they joined the Religious Life, the Priesthood, Marriage, became martyred)

After consulting with your sponsor, teens you are asked to completed the Saint Information page. The Saint information page (attached) is due no later than February 1, 2025.
